From the Principal

Last week I had the pleasure, along with other principals from Broken Hill, in representing Far West at the inaugural Rural and Remote Education Conference held at Mount Panorama in Bathurst. It was a great experience with the focus firmly planted on 21st century learning and how schools are accepting the challenges of the rapid pace that our society is moving into a changing world of having the "skills needed" as opposed to "knowledge and facts learned" world we all have known. To cope, you will hear more of having a growth mindset and the conference allowed us to revisit with Dan Haesler, a keynote speaker who visited Broken Hill and spoke to all educators on the first day of this year at the Civic Centre. I was fortunate to do a two hour workshop with Dan about the importance of giving valid feedback and how it assists with building up of resilience and "try and retry" in our students. Thomas Edison (with a huge team of scientists) tried 3000 light bulb prototypes before he got one to work imagine our world if they gave up. Evidence supports that telling students that every attempt is a good attempt can have drawbacks when the work becomes more challenging - the result is they often give up trying to learn. The approach of providing valid feedback that focuses on the task done instead of just "pumping up children's tyres" so to speak, is an important way to build resilience - a value of great importance in the new world.

Good luck and safe travel to our Barrier sporting representatives who are away for AFL (Central Coast), Basketball (Tamworth) this week. Next week it is Soccer (Glenwood, Sydney.)



Good effort Cohen, we are proud of you!






