Have a wonderful week of learning!

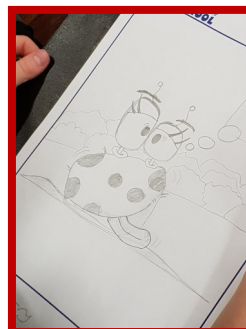

4. Resilience



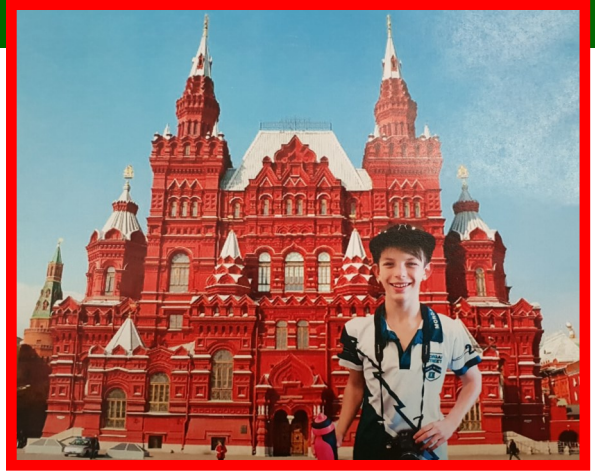
