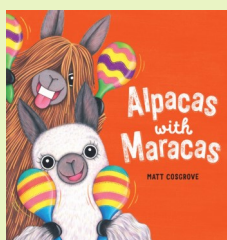

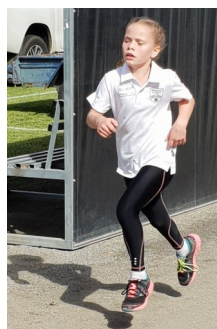

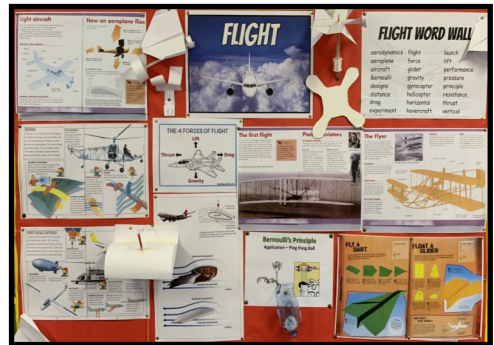
# THE 5WEEKLY

In maths, our class have been focusing on learning and mastering our 1-12 times tables. Mr Earl taught us 8 simple rules that would help us better remember our times tables and gave us posters to take home to place them on the back of our toilet door. We have posters on the back of the doors in the girls and boys toilets at school too!



We also played a fun competition that mixed times tables and Aussie Rules Football called 'Footy Tables'. Our class was divided up into 5 teams that played in a round robin competition followed by semi-finals and finishing off with a the grand final. The grand final was a heart stopping game which saw the Morks defeat the Equalisers 7 goals to 5. We also had end of season awards with Joseph Zanetti winning the Grand Final's Best on Ground, Kade Edwards winning the 5W Rising Star Award and Oscar Shoobridge winning The Wangmann (the seasons best and fairest).

In science, we have been studying the unit of 'Flight' as well as learning about the Scientific Method. We have learnt so many new things like the Wright Brothers inventing the first aeroplane, how Bernoulli's principle works, the 4 Forces of Flight, Igor Sikorsky inventing the first helicopter and how to make the best paper aeroplanes.



We designed and tested lots of different flying machines like the aerofoil, loopy aeroplane, gyrocopter, whirligig and a paper glider. Although some of our designs weren't successful, we still learnt from our failures. We also had a class competition who could fly a paper gilder the furthest. Ella Radford won with her design (The Ella) with an amazing flight distance of 23 metres! Congratulations Ella!

**FUN FACT:** In 2012, John Collins set the world record for the furthest flight by a paper plane. Thrown by football player Joe Ayoob, the glider, named "Suzanne," after Collins' wife, flew 69.14 meters. Wow!
