Kindergarten and Year 1 students will travel to Picton Oval by bus at 10.30 am and return at 1.15pm.

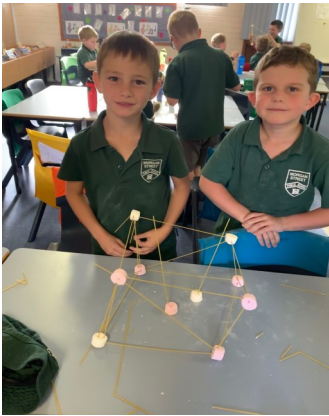
