Did you know that energy cannot be created or destroyed. It can only be transferred or transformed?

We completed an "energy survey" around the school and found that there is a difference between the energy some objects emit and the energy they use. Here are some of our findings:

- ♦ Speakers emit sound energy but use electrical energy
- ♦ Lights emit light energy but use electrical energy
- ♦ Our taps and bubblers emit chemical energy but use kinetic energy to turn them on.

What would you do (for a career) if you weren't doing this?

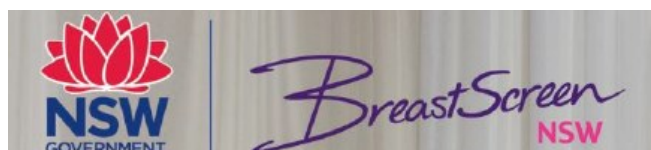
Whilst growing up I always wanted to be a dolphin trainer and perform shows at Seaworld. I miss the ocean and still believe that working with dolphins would be a cool job.
