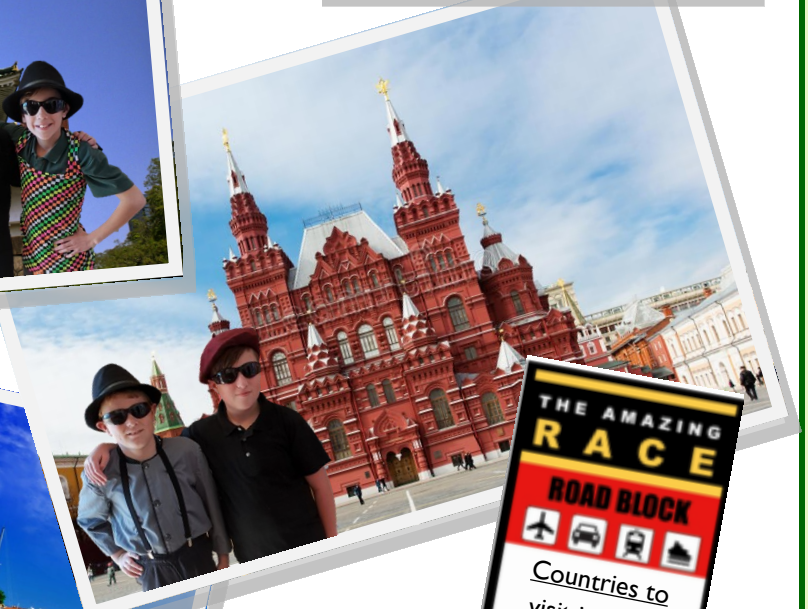
THE AMAZING RACE
