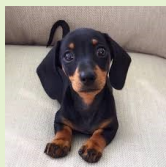

Have a wonderful week of learning!

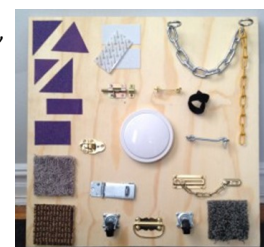
