On Friday we returned home, exhausted after a jam packed, fun filled couple of days.

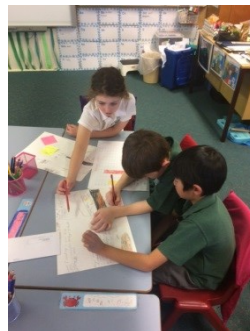
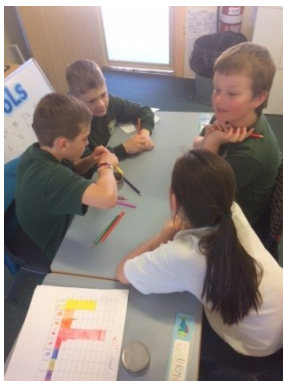
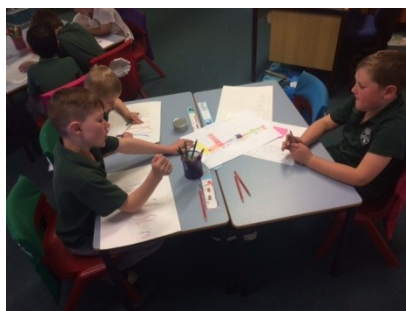
2S AND 1D – PROJECT-BASED LEARNING

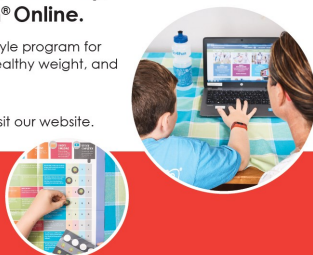
