

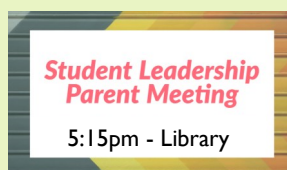

We also look forward to having a great last term with our Year 6 students as we help them transition to high school.

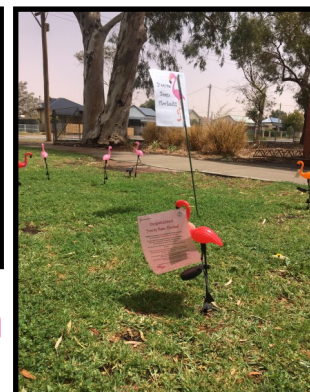
